Mission

The mission of the ASSIST Agency is to raise the standard of living and improve the quality of life for economically challenged individuals, families, and communities in Southwestern Louisiana.

Vision Statement

To have the public trust and be recognized as a leader in helping to empower people in becoming more self-sufficient and to help in strengthening local communities in becoming more responsive to the needs of the people.

The ASSIST Agency carries out its mission through a variety of means including community-wide assessment of needs and strengths, comprehensive antipoverty plans and strategies, provision of a broad range of direct services, mobilization of financial and non-financial resources, advocacy on behalf of low-income people and partnership with other community-based organizations to eliminate poverty.

Everyone Is Significant

During my second year of nursing school our professor gave us a quiz. I breezed through the questions until I read the last one: "What is the first name of the woman who cleans the school?" Surely this was a joke. I had seen the cleaning woman several times, but how would I know her name? I handed in my paper, leaving the last question blank.

Before the class ended, one student asked if the last question would count toward our grade. "Absolutely," the professor said. "In your careers, you will meet many people. All are significant. They deserve your attention and care, even if all you do is smile and say hello." I've never forgotten that lesson. I also learned her name was Dorothy.

Programs and Impacts - Success Stories

Kitty – Homeless Prevention; United Way of Acadiana IDA Scholarship Program We heard about the IDA scholarship program and my husband needed the money to enter truck driving school. He had lost his job driving a small truck and was not certified to drive big trucks. We felt that if he could get certified for big trucks, this would help our family of six become self-sufficient. We met with Ms. Edna about the scholarship and while doing paperwork, she noticed we had no income to pay the upcoming rent and utilities. At the time, I thought we would be able to find the money to pay the bills. My husband received the scholarship and began a six week driving course.

After paying the rent and utilities for first month my husband was in school, we were unable to find the money to pay the rent and utilities for the next month. I remembered Ms. Edna telling me that if we needed help to contact ASSIST for an appointment. I made an appointment with ASSIST and applied for ESG Homeless Prevention Funds. We received help with our rent and utilities and my husband finished truck driving school. He found a good job and we are still in our home and doing well. If it had not been for the help from ASSIST, ESG funds and IDA funds, we would not be making it on our own.

Amber – Shelter and Rapid Rehousing

I came to the ASSIST Shelter after living on the street in Lafayette. I was glad to have a place to live. I walked over a mile to work every day for a week to see if they had my application for employment and had made a decision on it yet. My persistence paid off and they hired me. I worked for a week and they promoted me to shift lead. I was anxious to have my own home and I applied for the ESG Rapid Rehousing funds. I qualified for assistance and found a nice house in Crowley close to work. The Rapid Rehousing funds helped me with the deposits for rent and utilities. I finally have a place of my own. I have been able to pay the rent and utilities and love my new house. The ASSIST Emergency Shelter gave me a chance to get myself together and find a stability in my life. I appreciate the Agency helping me get into my own home too. Without this assistance, I would still be homeless.

Kim – United Way of Acadiana IDA Scholarship Program

Kim is a 49-year-old male who has never worked in his lifetime. He has decided to go to SLCC to become a certified welder. He received a grant to cover his tuition, but was lacking the money for the equipment required for the course. He was referred to ASSIST by SLCC for the IDA scholarship program. We worked with Kim providing financial education along with the scholarship. He was able to purchase his equipment and began class in the Fall Semester. He is very grateful and really likes the course.



Kerry Stutes, with the ASSIST Agency, participated in the Resource Fair in Lafayette held for victims of Hurricane Harvey who had evacuated to our area. Acadiana Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (AVOAD) coordinated the fair with many area agencies.

The ASSIST Agency is always ready to help in times of crisis.











As part of our mission to raise the standard of living and improve the quality of life for economically challenged individuals, families, and communities in Southwestern Louisiana, the Agency was active in bringing together resources for the people to access the many services available in the parish. ASSIST sponsored a Resource Fairs in Jeff Davis Parish (above left) and in Vermilion Parish (above right.) It brought together service providers and the public resulting in more availability of assistance for those who are struggling. A free lunch was provided for attendees.



The Summer Feeding and Recreation Program held in Jeff Davis and Acadia Parishes provided a safe environment that combined learning and fun for 416 children and youth. Breakfast and lunch were served free of charge to participants with a total 20,137 meals served to children during the program. Above, the participants enjoyed a visit to Jennings Visitors Center and got to hold a live alligator.



In conjunction with the United Way of Acadiana, the United Way of Southwest Louisiana and the IRS VITA program, the agency provides free tax preparation for low- to medium-income families and individuals. Last year over \$567,000 was returned to filers in Earned Income Tax Credits in Acadia, Jeff Davis and Vermilion Parishes.

In 2017, the following programs worked to raise the standard of living and improve the quality of life for our communities. Additional programs provided the following:

- Elderly Assistance program provided rent/mortgage, utility, and medication assistance to 1,013 seniors.
- Emergency Assistance programs provided rent/mortgage and utility assistance to 407 individuals and families.
- The agency distributed 768 bags of clothing and 35,346 food boxes throughout the year.
- Information and referral services to 1,883 individuals.
- Forty-five families/individuals obtained or maintained safe and affordable housing.
- As part of the financial education provided by ASSIST, 497 families/individuals developed and followed a budget for at least 90 days.



The ASSIST Emergency Shelter housed 29 families in 2017. The Shelter provides a safe environment where the residents can work toward obtaining permanent housing. We provide support and life skills training so that the residents can become self-sufficient. Twelve families moved into permanent and affordable housing upon leaving the Shelter.





Offering quality childcare at affordable rates, Class "A" licensed childcare centers are operated by the Friends of ASSIST. The centers are located in Church Point and Rayne. They are open to the general public, accept children ages six weeks to 12 years and offer full time, part time, and after school care in a nurturing environment. These daycare centers allow low- to middle-income families to gain or maintain employment by having their children cared for while they work. The centers assisted 43 families with childcare in 2017.

Thanks to the US Marines the Toys for Tots program is a big success each year. In 2017 we distributed toys to 445 children in Acadia, 113 children in Jeff Davis and 304 children in Vermilion. Thanks to Ms. Mamie's Casino and Dollar General we were able to assist 163 children who had missed Toys for Tots in Crowley. HISTORY of COMMUNITY ACTION

On August 20, 1964 President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Economic Opportunity Act which created a variety of programs, including Community Action Agencies, as part of his War on Poverty. He knew then as we know now, that the war against poverty must be won in the field, in every private home, in every public office, from the courthouse to the White House. "Community Action Month is a wonderful time to honor and celebrate the impact Community Action has in the lives of families and communities across the country," stated Denise Harlow, National Community Action Partnership CEO. "Agencies are successful every day in helping families achieve economic security. Given that the needs of each family and community are unique, Community Action is able to use a range of resources and programs to meet local needs in creative and impactful ways."

The ASSIST Agency was established in 1967 to wage the war on poverty on a personal level in Southwestern Louisiana, particularly in Acadia, Jeff Davis and Vermilion Parishes, by promoting self-sufficiency for those of limited income ensuring that all residents are able to live in dignity; by implementing innovative and cost-effective programs to improve the lives and living conditions of the impoverished; by providing support and instruction for everyone in need of assistance; and by being a major voice of reason in establishing welfare system reforms.

The ASSIST Agency statistics underscore the positive impact we've had on our neighborhoods. We help countless individuals improve their lives each year by providing them essential services and life-changing opportunities through Individual Development Accounts, financial education and job training as well as making available affordable housing, economic development, natural disaster relief and recovery, health care, energy assistance, and so much more.



We continue to fulfill our mission of helping people, changing lives, we ask that the community continue to support us.


