PROGRAM IMPACTS AND SUCCESS STORIES

Mary – FEMA EF&S funds, Housing Counseling Programs

Mary came to the ASSIST Agency after her husband was laid off of his job. They have three children. While waiting for unemployment benefits to begin, they were struggling to pay the mortgage and utilities. The Agency was able to help pay some of the utility bills and made referrals to other agencies for additional help with utilities and food. Financial counseling helped the family develop a budget that would work with the reduced income from unemployment benefits. We discussed options available for help with mortgage payments and how to access them. Ways to reduce the costs of electricity and water were discussed and Mrs. M felt her family could put those ideas into practice. Upon follow-up in December, the family was receiving the unemployment benefits and had been able to reduce their spending to meet the budgeted amounts.

Monica – Emergency Shelter, Emergency Solutions Grant Rapid Rehousing Programs

Monica and her two children were homeless when entering the ASSIST Emergency Shelter. During her stay at the shelter, she received education on life skills that would help her become self-sufficient, including parenting skills, budgeting, acquiring and maintaining housing, and more. The ESG Grant helped her with deposits for rent and utilities to establish independent living in a safe and affordable home. Case management with Monica helped her to maintain her independent living.

<u>Fred – Elderly Assistance Program</u>

Fred is in his eighties and lives on a fixed income. He has Medicare benefits for most of his medical expenses. However, the total copay costs of his medicines each month take a big bite out of his income. Through the Elderly Assistance Program, the Agency helped Fred pay his copayments which helped him stretch his budget to cover the costs of maintaining his residence.

Claire – United Way of Southwest Louisiana, Housing Counseling

Claire is employed by a fast food company. She was out of work sick for four days for which she was not paid. The temporary drop in income caused her to have to choose between paying rent or utilities. She applied for emergency funds to help pay her rent which helped her be able to pay her utilities. After receiving rental assistance and housing counseling, Claire was able to get back on track and continue paying her housing costs and remain stably housed.

Tricia – United Way of Acadiana VITA and Incentivized Savings Program

Tricia filed her tax return at the ASSIST office through the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program sponsored by the United Way of Acadiana. She used her refund money to invest in the Incentivized Savings Program. She met with the ASSIST Agency Eligibility/Services Coordinator, who served as her financial coach for the program, each month for one year. Tricia made regular deposits to the savings account she opened with her tax refund. At the end of the year she had saved

\$4000.00. She completed all requirement of the program and the United Way of Acadiana provided her with a match of \$2000.00! Tricia was very pleased and said, "Where else could you get a 50% return on an investment? I will use this money for my retirement."

During the Fiscal year 2017-2018 the ASSIST Agency provided services to 1803 households consisting of a total of 4,691 people.

- 40 children ages 0-5 were enrolled in Little Friends Child Care Centers
 - 21 children demonstrated improved literacy skills
 - 16 children demonstrated skills for school readiness


- 169 children received school supplies donated by the community
- 939 children participated in the 2018 Summer Food and Recreation Programs in Acadia and Jeff Davis Parishes
 - o 7,553 breakfasts and 10,422 lunches were served to participants
 - o 82% of participants in the Recreation Program improved or maintained math skills
 - o 84% improved or maintained grade level reading skills
- 615 households received housing payment assistance for rent or mortgage
- 497 households received utility payment assistance
- 479 individuals/families requested placement in the ASSIST Emergency Shelter. The shelter is an 8-bed facility and many of the households were put on the waiting list or referred to other shelters or housing solutions.
 - o 34 Individuals and families entered the Emergency Shelter
 - 4 residents moved from the shelter into independent permanent housing with no subsidy
 - 11 residents moved into permanent housing with family members or friends
 - 2 residents moved into Permanent Supportive Housing Programs
- 19 people participated in the United Way of Acadiana Incentivized Savings Program


- 18 improved their credit scores
- 18 increased their net worth
- 644 households received financial help with rent and/or utilities through funds from the United Way of Southwest Louisiana, United Way of Acadiana, CSBG, Emergency Solutions Grant, fundraising and donations
- 374 households who were seen by the Agency received financial coaching/counseling to improve their housing stability.
- 27 households obtained safe and affordable housing through the Emergency Solutions Grant Homeless Prevention/Rapid Rehousing funds.
- 56 households avoided eviction as a result of participation in ASSIST Agency programs.
- 18 households experienced improved health and safety due to improvements such as smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and handicap accessible modifications through funds from the Acadia Parish Police Jury and the Red Cross.
- 452 seniors (ages 60+) maintained an independent living situation as a result of assistance from the Agency
- 311 individuals with disabilities maintained an independent living situation as a result of assistance from the Agency
- 15,448 meals were served to over 325 children ages 5-18 in the 2018 Summer Feeding and Recreation Programs in Acadia and Jeff Davis Parishes
- ASSIST Agency is part of Acadiana Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD.) In 2017 the Agency participated in disaster recovery for the evacuee's in the path of Hurricane Harvey which affected East Texas and Southwestern Louisiana.
